Broadway Museum & Art Gallery is housed in a beautiful 17th Century former coaching inn. The building, built as The Angel Inn is one of a very few historic buildings in Broadway today, that is open to the public.

So why not come inside and explore.

Step inside Broadway Museum to discover the story of Broadway, explore our exhibitions and be transported back in time.

## At a Glance

### Level Access

- The main entrance has level access with a ramp. The ramp is portable.
- There is level access from the main entrance to:
  - Introductory Room
  - outside toilet
  - Great Parlour
  - Kitchen
  - courtyard

- There are steps from the main entrance to:
  - Reception
  - Museum Gift Shop
  - Artists room -First Floor
  - Ceramics room
  - Broadway in the war
  - Broadway Postcard Room
  - Exhibition space and Childrens' Room
  - Fourth Floor

## **Travel by public transport**

- You can get to Broadway Museum & Art Gallery by bus and train.
- The nearest bus stop to Broadway Museum is 150 meters away, on the High Street, Broadway The bus stop is 0.01 miles / 241.5 km from Broadway Museum & Art Gallery.
- The nearest train station is Broadway Train Station. The train station is 1 miles / 1.6 km from Broadway Museum & Art Gallery.
- Broadway Train Station of part of Gloucester Warwickshire Steam Railway and is not part of the National Rail Network, connecting only to Cheltenham, Toddington, Laverton and Winchcombe. The nearest national rail station is Evesham 6 miles away.



### Travel by taxi

- You can get a taxi with Bobs Taxis by calling 07880 692843.
- You can get a taxi with 1st Call Taxis by calling 07766 218218. The taxi company has a wheelchair accessible vehicle.
- You can get a taxi with BR Taxis by calling 01386 303030.



### Parking

- There is a drop-off point at the main entrance. The drop-off point has a dropped kerb.
- There is On Street Disabled parking which is not time limited outside of the Museum Entrance on the opposite side of the road. You can also drop off directly outside the museum entrance. We are within easy reach of two long stay car parks with further disabled parking.

## Arrival



### Path to main entrance

- From the street to the main entrance, there is level access.
- The path is 1000mm wide, or more.
- The path is sloped.



### Main entrance

- The main entrance has level access.
- There is a portable ramp.
- The door is 830mm wide.
- The main door is side hung and manual.
- Our main entrance provides access to our shop and requires 1 further step without handrail and side hung 850mm door to access the shop.

Ramp access is available via the rear courtyard. Visitors are asked to contact the museum before visiting to ensure assistance with the ramp can be given.

## Getting around inside

### Visual Impairment - General Information

- Some parts of the venue have low lighting.



### Ticket/ information desk

### Reception

- From the main entrance to this desk, there are 3 steps. There is no lift and no ramp.
- The desk has a low section.
- steps are 2 shallow steps then an additional one from the main entrance into the museum.

There is one step from the introductory room, where ramp access would be available into the reception/shop.

However, anyone using the courtyard access would be met and greeted in the introductory room.

### Things to See and Do

- We have a complimentary ticket policy for personal assistants.
- We have performances with: captioned.

### Introductory Room

- From the main entrance to this area, there is level access. There is a portable ramp. The route is 640mm wide, or more. The door is 640mm wide.
- Some display information is low, for wheelchair users. There are seats.
- There is a hearing loop.
- Videos have subtitles.

### Public toilet

#### outside toilet

- There is a public toilet for disabled visitors.
- The toilet is a Changing Places toilet.
- From the main entrance to the public toilet, there is level access. The route is 2770mm wide, or more.
- The toilet door is 1120mm wide.
- The direction of transfer onto the toilet is to the right.
- There is 950mm at the side of the toilet. There is 2340mm in front of the toilet. The toilet seat is 490mm high. The toilets have handrails.
- The toilet is easily accessible via a wide entrance into the museum front entrance.

### Shop

#### Museum Gift Shop

- From the main entrance to the shop, there are 3 steps. There is no lift and no ramp.
- The route through the shop is 800mm wide, or more.

#### Great Parlour

- From the main entrance to this area, there is level access. There is a portable ramp. The route is 800mm wide, or more.
- The door is 800mm wide.
- From the main entrance to this area, there are 3 steps. There is no lift and no ramp.

#### Kitchen

- From the main entrance to this area, there is level access. There is a portable ramp. The route is 725mm wide, or more.
- The door is 725mm wide.

#### Artists room -First Floor

- From the main entrance to this area, there are 16 steps. There is no lift and no ramp.
- Stairs from Ground floor

#### **Ceramics room**

- From the main entrance to this area, there are 16 steps. There is no lift and no ramp.
- Stairs from from ground floor- level from landing

#### **Broadway in the war**

- From the main entrance to this area, there are 16 steps. There is no lift and no ramp.
- 16 steps from ground floor  
1 step down from Ceramics room

#### **Broadway Postcard Room**

- From the main entrance to this area, there are 16 steps. There is no lift and no ramp.
- 16 steps from ground floor

#### Exhibition space and Childrens' Room

- From the main entrance to this area, there are 14 steps. There is no lift and no ramp.
- 14 steps from first floor. Level within space

#### Fourth Floor

- From the main entrance to this area, there are 13 steps. There is no lift and no ramp.
- 13 steps from second floor, level within the floor space

### Getting around outside

#### courtyard

- From the main entrance to this area, there is level access. There is a portable ramp.
- This is an open area with no doors
