## A QUINTESSENTIALLY ENGLISH COUNTRY DESTINATION

Broadway Tower & Park is a family-owned Cotswold destination set within a 200-acre estate of parkland, allowing visitors to experience great English heritage in an inspiring location. Your ticket includes all you need for a memorable day – Tower Museum with roof platform, the Deer Park or walking the grounds with your picnic.



The Gloucestershire Warwickshire Railway is a volunteer operated heritage railway in Gloucestershire and Worcestershire offering a round trip of 28 miles. It uses part of the route of the former Great Western Railway's main line from Birmingham to Cheltenham which used to run via Stratford-upon-Avon.

It now operates steam and heritage diesel trains between Cheltenham Racecourse and Broadway through some of the most spectacular scenery in the Cotswolds. The line commands wonderful views of the nearby sleepy hamlets and villages, with outstanding outlooks across to the Malvern Hills and beyond.



## GORDON RUSSELL DESIGN MUSEUM



Explore the world of 20th century furniture design through the life and work of Sir Gordon Russell (1892-1980) and his company. Founded in Broadway in the early 1920s, Gordon Russell went on to become one of the most influential names in British design. The remarkable story spans Arts and Crafts cabinetmaking, early radio and television, the wartime Utility Furniture Scheme, The Festival of Britain, and beyond. The museum shop Plane & Saw brings the story up to the present day featuring a unique selection of crafts, gifts and homewares by contemporary makers.



## SNOWSHILL MANOR



Snowhill Manor and Garden is the unconventional home of the artist, poet, architect and life-long collector, Charles Wade, who delighted in creating a stage for his life and passions. Visit the Manor House, Arts and Crafts garden and the cottage where Wade lived and find



unexpected delights hidden round every corner. Cared for by the National Trust since 1952 Snowhill Manor is a memorable day out for the whole family.
